Description/content

The Master of International Affairs (MIA) is a two-year, full-time programme taught entirely in English that equips students with tools of international policy-making to tackle global challenges and devise sound policy proposals in a global multi-level system. Understanding how to navigate this complex landscape of diverse actors and disciplines is at the core of the programme. The MIA programme prepares students for positions requiring a profound understanding of today's global policy challenges in government, diplomacy and international organisations, business and civil society.

Specialise in one area of international affairs

Students attend courses in global politics, international law and security policy. In a practice course on international negotiation, students gain highly applicable skills in conflict management, EU problem-solving or international diplomacy.

In their second semester, students choose one area of concentration:

- International security Tackle today's global security problems in national government, international organisations, NGOs, think tanks and academia as well as the private sector.
- European governance Gain a solid foundation in the EU's internal workings and explore the interaction between EU and national law, politics and policy.
- Human rights and global governance Focus on human rights and international law, and understand the complex challenges posed by multinational policy-making.

Additionally, students take courses from a wide portfolio of electives to deepen their expertise in a field of international affairs. These courses give students the knowledge, concepts and tools they need to write their Master's thesis on a concrete problem in international policy.

Course Details

Course organisation

In their **first semester** at the Hertie School, students take foundational courses in international law, global politics, economics and statistics. For their **second semester**, MIA students choose an area of concentration:

- International security
- European governance
- Human rights and global governance

In addition to two concentration courses, students deepen their knowledge in either economics or statistics and take a practical course in international negotiation.

Students complete a **summer internship** between their first and second year of study. Alternatively, they are offered the opportunity to gain even more substantial work experience during a "Professional Year".

In their **third and fourth semesters**, MIA students complete a total of six elective courses – including at least three in their chosen specialisation – and apply the concepts and tools they have learned in a Master's thesis.

Integrated study abroad unit(s)

The Hertie School is a member of the Association of Professional Schools of International Affairs (APSIA), CIVICA — The European University of Social Sciences and the Global Public Policy Network (GPPN).

MIA students have the opportunity to apply for adual-degree programme with one of the following partners:

- Bocconi University (Italy)
- Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs, Syracuse University (USA)
- Munk School of Global Affairs, University of Toronto (Canada)
- School of International and Public Affairs, Columbia University (USA)

Dual-degree students complete one year of study at the partner institution and receive degrees from both institutions.

Alternatively, one-semester exchange programmes are offered at a number of partner universities around the world, such as The Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Switzerland, the Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals in Spain or Fudan University in China.

Integrated internships

All students complete a summer **internship** between their first and second year of study. The Hertie School partners with institutions from all three sectors to offer internship positions.

If you want even more working experience, you can apply to complete a full 'Professional Year" between the first and second year of your studies. The professional year is not compulsory but offers an excellent opportunity for students to gain professional experience during their studies.

Description of the above- mentioned funding opportunities within the university	The Hertie School is committed to attracting the best students from around the world. To achieve this goal, we provide financial support to students in the form of full and partial scholarships. Currently, about half of our students receive funding directly from the school. Our Student Funding Office also offers assistance in finding external funding options.

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements

Applicants must have completed an undergraduate degree (BA or its international equivalent) and must be fluent in English. See our website for detailed admission requirements .

All applications are assessed based on the following criteria:

- Personal suitability: CV, professional experience, entrepreneurship, international experience, civic engagement; weight: 40%
- Academic excellence: Strength of academic background, academic performance grades/transcripts, general academic qualification, linguistic qualification; weight: 40%
- Motivation: Convincing motivation to study international affairs, motivation to study at the Hertie School, overall coherence; weight: 20%

Language requirements

Unless you are a native speaker or you have completed your entire undergraduate degree at an English-language university, you must verify your language skills with an **official English test**.

The Hertie School recognises the Cambridge ESOL qualifications CPE (C), CAE (B), and the IELTS (7.0 overall and 7.0 in writing) as well as the TOEFL test (PBT 600; CBT 250; iBT 100, writing: 25) and the online Duolingo exam (125).

The Hertie School is a private university based in Berlin, Germany. Founded in 2003 by the Hertie Foundation, the Hertie School became Germany's first professional school for public policy and was granted official state recognition in 2005.

Interdisciplinary and practice-oriented teaching, first-class research and an extensive international network set the Hertie School apart. In preparing exceptional students for leadership positions in government, business, and civil society, the Hertie School is positioned as an ambassador of good governance and is characterised by public debate and engagement. "Understand today. Shape tomorrow." is our motto.

The Hertie School has four Master's programmes: the Master of Public Policy (since 2005), the Executive Master of Public Administration (since 2008), the Master of International Affairs (since 2015), and the Master of Data Science for Public Policy (since 2020).

In 2011, the Hertie School was one of the few private universities in Germany to receive the right to award doctorates. The doctoral programme in Governance started in 2012.

University location

Berlin is in the heart of Europe. And we are in the heart of Berlin.
